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Our Newest COVID-19 Tools: Diagnosis, Treatment, and Vaccines Elizabeth Talbot, MD

Deputy State Epidemiologist, NH Department of Health and Human Services Associate Professor of Infectious Disease and International Health, Geisel School of Medicine at Dartmouth

Dr. Talbot is an infectious diseases- and tropical medicine-trained internist, who has had extensive experience in international and domestic infectious disease control through outbreak investigation, clinical projects, research, and consultation. She trained at Duke University and with the Epidemic Intelligence Service during which she was stationed in Botswana with the CDC then the World Health Organization before coming to Dartmouth where she is a Professor of Medicine in the Section of Infectious Diseases and International Health at the Geisel Medical School at Dartmouth. Her primary research interest is infectious disease diagnostics, especially for global tuberculosis control. Since 2003, Dr. Talbot has been NH's Deputy State Epidemiologist, where she is currently engaged in leadership for COVID-19 pandemic response.
