


HAI Investigations

 - ▶ 18 ICARs Completed in Total
 - ▶ 16 LTCFs
 - 1 Hospital
 - ▶ 1 Dental Practice

ICAR Trends

- Common strengths:
 - Staff are trained and can demonstrate proper donning and doffing procedures
 - Hand Hygiene
 - Contact Time
 - Screening visitors and staff
 - COVID-19 Testing



ICAR Trends

- Common areas of improvement:
 - Lack of staffing
 - Not all necessary staff are fit tested to wear N95s
 - Including a compliance audit with PPE, hand hygiene, environmental cleaning.
 - Staffing knowing their role involved in environmental cleaning



Reports

- Healthcare Worker Influenza vaccination data will be requested in early April
- Antibiogram 2021 data has been requested
- Ambulatory Surgery Centers
 - Quarter 4 data (Oct 1st to Dec 31st) due on or before March 1st

Grants

- Nursing Home & Long-term Care Facility STRIKE Team and Infrastructure
 - 2.7 Million
 - Either July 31st 2024 or 1 year after the end of the public health emergency
 - Main objective: build short and long term staffing capacity in long term care settings
- Strengthening HAI/AR Program Capacity (SHARP)
 - 2.7 Million
 - July 31st 2024
 - Main objective: build capacity in the NH HAI program



Grants

- National Initiative to Address COVID-19 Public Health Disparities among Populations at High-Risk and Underserved, Including Racial and Ethnic Minority Populations and Rural Communities
 - \$200,000.00
 - 5/2023
 - Main objective: Provide infection control and prevention support to correctional facilities
